## OVERVIEW

PAMNEX the Graduate Committee of Pertubuhan Akitek Malaysia aims to be the definitive and impactful body, having been the leading voice and action representing Malaysian Graduate Architects and about 1,300 PAM Graduate and Associate members. Being the second, largest membership category in the Institute, PAMNEX exemplifies excellence, diversity, inclusion and advocacy. PAMNEX strives to work towards development of Graduate talent, economy, career development and community partnership.

This year the campaign adopted by the committee was "What Defines You?" which aims at promoting the involvement of members of the Institute to join in activities that would redefine the role, image and impact of the Graduate Community.

Leader by Chairman Dr. Najah Mohd Alwi, the committee has convened a total of 9 committee meetings commencing with the First meeting on 10th June 2021 and a final meeting on the 9th March 2022. A total of 7 webinars and 6 events were organised by the PAM Graduate Team and our partners.

At the institutional level this year, the committee looks forward towards the amendment to the constitution to allow the Graduate Representative on Council to be elected via voting, and to have voting rights on council, as part of the continued staking and growing role of Graduates on the future of the institution. The constitutional amendment was written by Ar. David Teoh, would be proposed at the PAM EGM on the 14th April 2022, with proposed amendments to

clause 8.10 and proposed new clause 8.8a and 24.9 of the PAM Constitution.

The institute approved a Graduate membership entrance fee subsidy which was passed on the 25th July 2021. The subsidy was motioned by the Chairman of Committee Dr. Najah Md Alwi and initially was suggested by PAM President Datuk Ar. Ezumi Harzani Ismail from an engagement session with Graduates. The implementation was successful with 88 successful applicants obtaining the financial subsidy worth RM 22,000.

PAMNEX also managed to create impactful work and presence in response, relief, technical support and research on Disaster Operations jointly with PAM CSR Committee by successfully forming and operating a disaster operations committee- Bilik Gerakan Bencana [BGB-PAM] in conjunction with the 18th December 2022 Nationwide Flood disaster. BGB-PAM worked closely amongst others, with our main humanitarian partner Malaysian Medical Relief Society (MERCY Malaysia) in adopting humanitarian and technical relief and site assessment of Batu 12-Batu 19, Hulu Langat Selangor. In total about 300 homes and an area of over 10 miles were covered through 8 cycles of site assessments and 3 site recce trips. This effort was leader on the committee side by Mr. Taufiq Nazarudin, Ms. Cheah Ee Von and Ms. Wan Siti Hajar.

Much of the projects embarked upon by the Graduate committee involves cross-committee works to ensure foresight, due process and inclusion with the aims of better outcome.

Other committees that the Graduate committee has joint projects with are as follows;

- i- Constitutional Review Committee
- ii- Housing & Urban Well-being Committee
- iii- Membership & Events
- iv- CPD Unlimited
- v- CSR - Bilik Gerakan Bencana
- vi- Gender Equity Special Committee

In terms of community partnerships, PAMNEX had promoted programs in the field of mentorship, entrepreneurship, career pathways, talent development, industry skill, heritage, gender equitability, innovation, technology, amongst others, keeping Graduates on track and a competitive edge. To make the programs accessible the programs took on many formats ranging from digital, to hybrid, and site based programs. The roadtour program would look at bridging the geo-strategic divide between Graduates and explore the potential of collaborative partnerships.



In conclusion, PAMNEX was able to collaborate with 15 organisations and a total of 50 collaborators to impart impact on the continued agenda of Graduate Architects. We call on the continued support of the strong and active Graduate Architect community to keep redefining the future of the industry and profession.

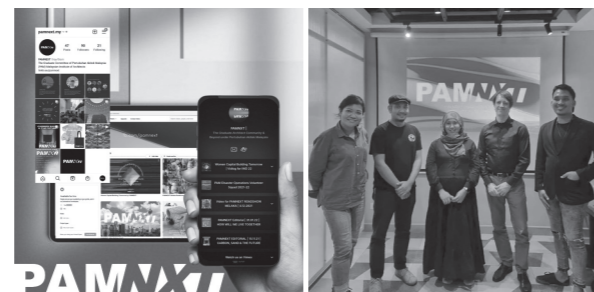


Figure 2 linktr.ee/pamnnext links all of Pamnext's digital platforms in one place ,increasing ease of use and accessibility for users.

**Graduate Entrance Fee Subsidy**

On 25th June 2021 and 25th February 2022, the Graduate Committee presented to the Council to waive the Entrance fee for Graduate Categories and it was approved by Council. The implementation was successful with 88 successful applicants obtaining the financial subsidy allocated, amounting to RM 22,000.

- This subsidy covered the following membership categories:
1. New Application for PAM Graduate Membership. (amendment approved on council 7th January 2022)
  2. Upgrade of membership from Student Member to Associate Graduate or Graduate member. (Approved on council 25th July 2021)

This subsidy makes use of an allocation approved by the PAM Council for expanding the membership of PAM Graduate membership. It aims to promote more participation and diversification of members in the institute, thus elevating discussion, exchange of ideas and future-proofing the institute by cultivating future leaders.

The subsidy was mooted by PAM President Datuk Ar. Ezumi Harzani Ismail, and was proposed to council by the Graduate Committee Chairman, Dr. Najah Md Alwi. The amendment to include New Graduate for Members was proposed by Mr.

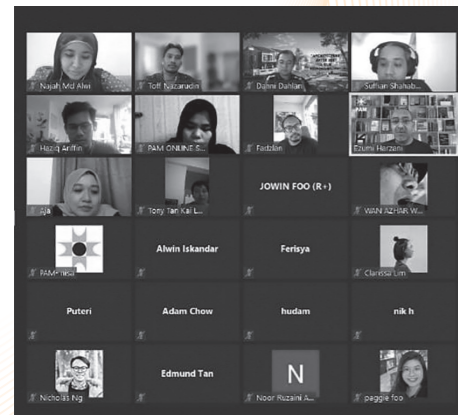


Figure 1 First Committee meeting 10th June 2021 via zoom

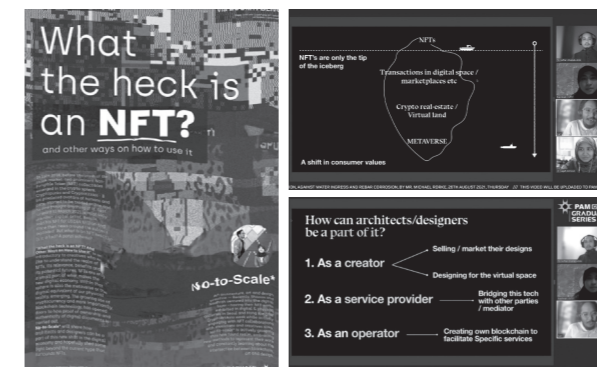


Figure 4 Event Poster

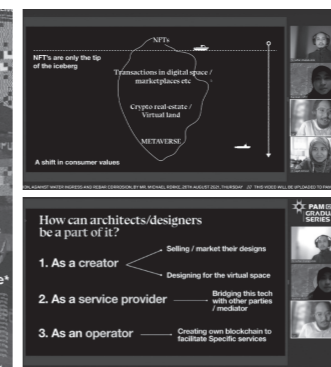


Figure 5 Ts. Suffian Shahbuddin, Ms Nurul Nadrah Azfah Azman, Mr Shamin Sharon and Dr. Najah Md. Alwi in the 'What The Heck is an NFT' session on the 20th August 2021

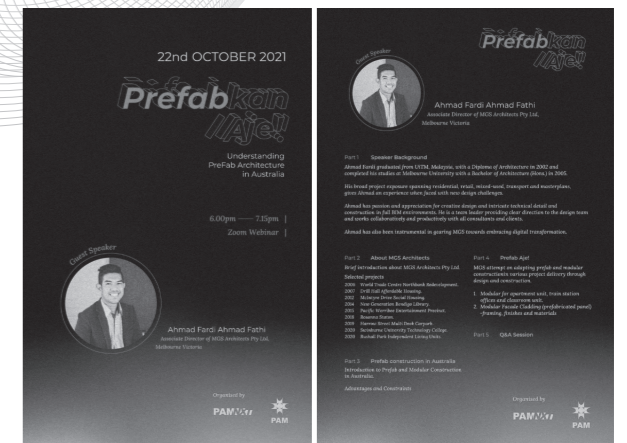


Figure 6 Prefabricated Architecture with Mr Ahmad Fardi from MGS Architects Pty Ltd.

**Kami-Mereka Design Campaign Competition**

Kami-Mereka was an initiative that looks to everyone who see design as a means for change and empower a creative centric society in Malaysia. Kami-Mereka is essentially a design competition to pitch ideas by proposing concepts or solutions in response to the various challenges we face today in Malaysia, particularly looking beyond life after the pandemic.

The competition formulated as a campaign to bridge 'design as solutions' to everyday issues was conducted through a guerrilla and rapid format, advocating participation from the public via Instagram within a tight program of 4 weeks.

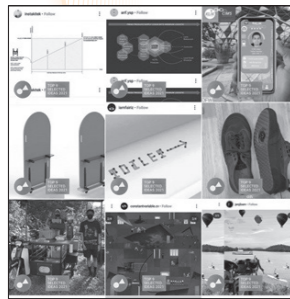
The medium of expression was done through open submission medium i.e.; writings, sketch, model, 3D rendering (or mix media) and participants can deliver their ideas through one's own creativity. The 3 main focus sectors that we hope participants will submit are in Health, Education and Economy that will cross 3 focus sectors; Public Place, Wearables and Virtual and Digital Environment.

The initiative is purely pro-bono and managed by Architectural Graduates, Ts. Suffian Shahabuddin (PAM Graduate Committee), Mr. Johan Ropi and Mr. Muhamad Razif Nasruddin.



Mr. Muhammad Razif stated that, "Designers should be more pragmatic in producing more ideas, and constantly share them as a discourse so that the gap between public and creatives can be more active. Like positive criticism, designers and the public must arrive at a space where they can exchange opinions and ideas."

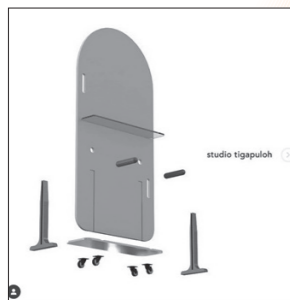

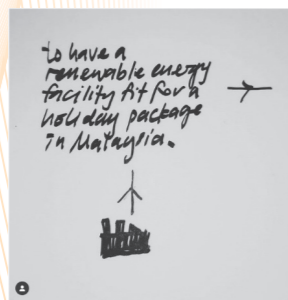

**A 1-DAY VIRTUAL CAREER SUMMIT for Creative Minds.**

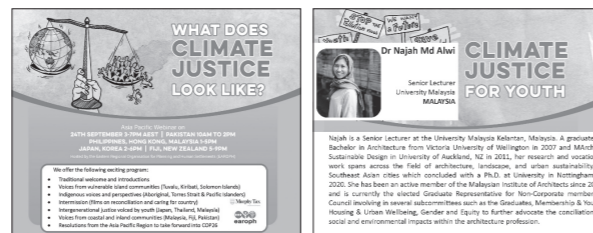

**EAROPH – Climate Justice Webinar**

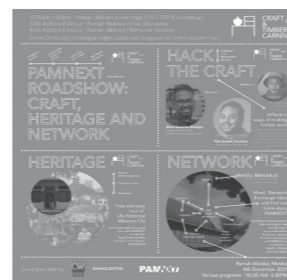

Dr Najah Md Alwi was nominated by PAM President and Chair of Housing & Urban Wellbeing to represent PAM Malaysia to voice for Climate Justice for Young professionals in the Built Environment, along with several others. This short presentation followed also into the UN Innovate 4 City program where Youth leaders continue to feed into current crisis for the climate.



**PAMNEXT Completes First Ever Graduate Roadshow, Hybrid (On-Site & Live) Event In Melaka With The Theme Craft, Heritage And Network.**

The PAMNEXT Graduate Melaka Roadshow was successfully held in Melaka on the 4th December 2021. Held as a first ever hybrid event, it featured a Tour of Heritage City Melaka, followed by Hybrid Digital event running simultaneously at PAMNEXT Booth in conjunction with the Malaysian Craft and Timber Carnival 2021 at Rumah Melaka, Bukit Katil, Melaka. This is also PAMNEXT's first ever physical event since the pandemic, as well as first ever Graduate Roadshow.

The theme of the PAMNEXT Graduate Roadshow was Craft, Heritage and Network to tie in the element of UNESCO World Heritage City of Melaka, as well as



celebrating the timber works, material and craft, and the architectural talent in design and innovation. Therefore, the organised programmes include a tour of the Heritage City of Melaka, and a hybrid online and live session on Discourse and Network session.

The Roadtour kicked off with the Heritage tour of Melaka City visiting the Royal Press Museum, the world's only polyglot royal printing press. The trip began at 9.00 am where the PAMNEXT Graduate Committee was given a private closed tour of the grounds of the museum to understand the heritage of press printing organised by Mr. Muhammad Al-Amin Mohd Fadel. The tour included a tour to the closed-off printing block archive located at the back of the museum, and a block-press print demonstration. After the tour concluded with a tour at 11.30 am to a local creative shop Akudesign run by Mr. Afiq Afifi.

The second half of the road tour was based at the PAMNEXT Booth at venue of the carnival, where the PAMNEXT organised a booth that explained the main activities of PAMNEXT Graduate Committee of Pertubuhan Akitek Malaysia, as well as example of design and innovation in timber buildings, material technology and materials. PAMNEXT also organised a hybrid (live and on-site) discourse and network session.

The Discourse on Hack the Craft featured a discussion specific to the agenda of understanding how Craft in timber and Heritage from the point of view from two accomplished speakers, Mr. Harith the Green Carpenter, a sustainable green factory operator, and product designer, as well as Mr. Zul Fadly M. Salleh who is a timber craft and joinery researcher sharing their point of views from where they lead in their fields for our understanding of timber craftworks. The session was moderated by Ms. Lydia Zilan from the PAMNEXT Graduate Committee.

The networking session saw interesting sharing from those in the Architecture field sharing knowledge and insight related to the theme of the Road tour. Moderated by Ms. Cheah Ee Von, Co-Chairman of the Graduate Committee, saw speakers such as Mr. Idham Badaruddin gave an insightful talk about Glulam (Laminated Timber) construction technology and standards, as well as Mrs. Nabihah Nazli shares her vision of using tech to aid in heritage conservation works.

This program was an invitation by CTCS Worldwide Sdn Bhd (CWSB), subsidiary of Malaysian Timber Industry Board (MTIB). The event was leader organised and officiated on-site by PAMNEXT Graduate Co-Chairman, Mr. Muhammad Taufiq Nazarudin and Mr. Muhamad Razif Nasruddin of

CWSB. A total of 30 people attended the event at the PAMNEXT Booth, while about an additional 150-170 reach via online.

**PAMNEXT Hack the Craft: The Green Factory Visit**

As part of the continuation of the Hack the Craft theme talk, the Green Factory hosted PAMNEXT Graduate Committee to its ground on Saturday, the 18th December 2022. The Green Factory is a community that promotes the cause of sustainability and the circular economy in terms of timber and product manufacturing.

About 12 PAM members and student registered and attended the half-day site-visit lead by PAM Co-Chairman, Mr Muhammad Taufiq Bin Nazarudin and Program Leader Mrs. Wan Siti Hajar whilst being hosted by Mr Harith Ridzuan, the Green Carpenter and director of the Green Factory.

The tour of the Green Factory gave an insight on how timber product design and manufacturing use design to promote the circular economy element of up-cycling and being responsive to climate change, while demonstrating how design is an added value in the value chain. Some highlights on site were to learn that the hub employed a majority of youths under 30 on-site, conduct product material research, it's digital and QR based inventory of materials and wastes, it's aim of zero waste, a harvest of used-timber from a heritage building, as well as extensive advocacy of sustainable agenda from the niche of product design.

**PAMNEXT Graduate Works Alongside PAM Community and Social Responsibility (CSR) Forms 'Bilik Gerakan Bencana'- Emergency Operations Centre (BGB-PAM) In Response To The Major Floods 18th December 2021**

In response to the recent major floods across the nation on the 18th December 2021, Graduate Committee (PAMNEXT) and Community and Social Responsibility Committee (PAM CSR) had jointly organised emergency response operations under Bilik Gerakan Bencana (BGB-PAM). A temporary joint committee presided over the activities which mainly serves to coordinate humanitarian, technical response as well as recommendation towards disaster management. Additionally a research team was formed to provide findings and recommendations from the data collection from site assessment in one of the disaster sites

Volunteer works were divided into three teams, namely *Squad Sukerelawan PAM* (PAM Volunteer Squad), PAM Disaster Mapping and PAM Disaster Research Team. A total of about 222 volunteers registered and attended various activities within the workgroups.

BGB-PAM worked closely amongst others, with our main humanitarian partner Malaysian Medical Relief Society (MERCY Malaysia) in adopting humanitarian and technical relief and site assessment of Batu 12 - Batu 19, Hulu Langat Selangor. In total about 300 homes and an area of over 10 miles were covered through 8 cycles of site assessments and 3 site recce trips. The intention of the report is to provide findings and recommendations in future disasters to infer management response, planning and management by the Institute.

The site assessments were also supported by a number of architecture schools from local institutions such International Islamic University Malaysia, UCSI University, University Technology MARA and Taylors University.

Humanitarian work attracted the most amount of volunteers providing response in ensuring site initial recovery such as making good in terms of hygiene, cleanliness and basic needs were met. 4 humanitarian responses were organised by PAM in collaboration with other Humanitarian Organisations such as MERCY Malaysia, Malaysian Relief Agency (MRA) and Pertubuhan IKRAM Malaysia (IKRAM).

PAMNEXT Graduate Co-Chairman, Mr. Muhammad Taufiq bin Nazarudin and Ms. Cheah Ee Von, represented the PAMNEXT Graduate committee on presiding matters supported by Project Officers, Ms. Nurul Huda and Mrs. Raja Nurul Hidayah as joint committee for BGB-PAM. Graduate members Mrs. Wan Siti Hajar participated actively as on-site representative on behalf of PAM.

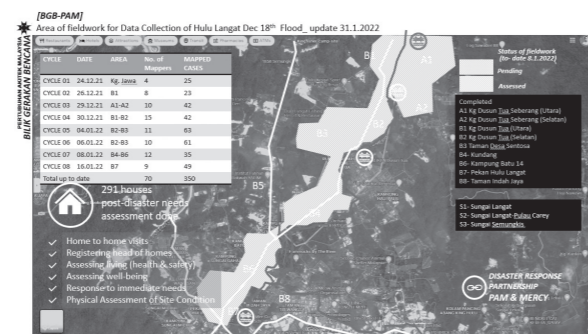


Figure 14 Area of Fieldwork for site assessment by BGB-PAM covered an area of over 10 miles and a total of 350 homes & households assessed

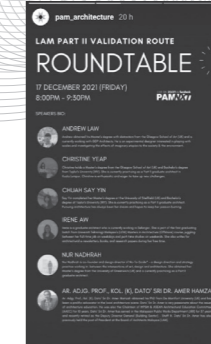
Figure 21 Mr. Taufiq Nazarudin briefing the Cycle 7 Site Assessment at Hulu Langat with volunteers from Universiti Teknologi MARA on how to use the Post Disaster Needs Assessment (PDNA) form, in collaboration between PAM and MERCY Malaysia

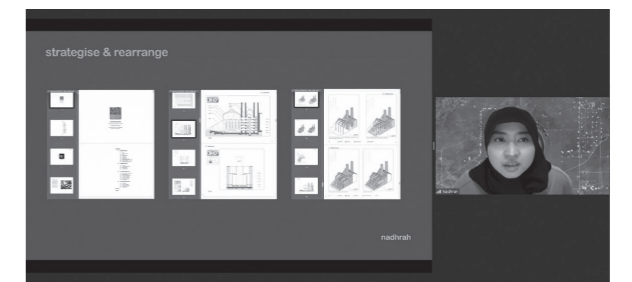


Figure 25 Ms. Nurul Nadrah shared some of her technical portfolio as part of her insight of work assessment required for the LAM Part II validation for her school work from Greenwich University, England

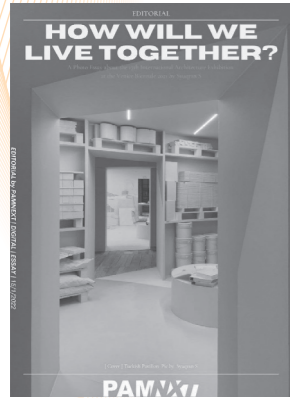


Figure 26 PAMNEXT Editorial | How will we live together by Syuqran Shamsuddin 31st January 2022, is the second digital issue covering the Venice Biennale 2021-17th Architecture Exhibition.

**Architects and multi-disciplinary fields' participants in the interactive workshop - RE (MUSE) – (RE) Imagining a 21st Century Malaysia Railway Museum**

RE(MUSE) is an interactive workshop jointly organized by Japan Foundation Kuala Lumpur (JFKL) and Projek Keretapi Kita was held at Rumah Tangsi KL on 19th February and 20th February 2022. This program was supported by PAMNEXT - Graduate Committee to allow our members to participate in a design-oriented workshop. 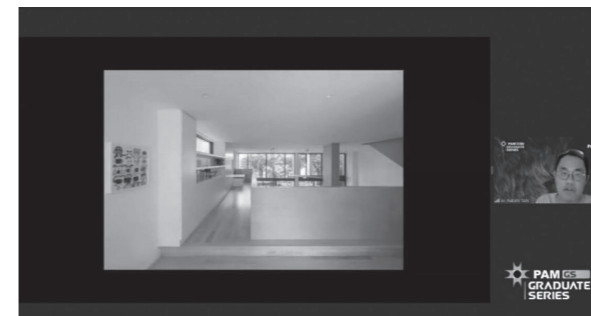


Figure 34 Ar. Fabian Tan shared on how a brand is related to the identity with a debatable statement for thought - 'Branding is not Architecture'. He highlighted that identity lies between substance and concept, and advised the young architects to focus on the substance of design, concept will come eventually
