## **SYNOPSIS**

The manuscript explores the various leadership styles of nine (9) renowned leaders in spearheading the institutions of higher learning in Malaysia. All the case studies were the result of sheer hard work and compilations done by nine (9) groups of authors through a series of interviews with the respective leaders within the course of three to four months.

The first case study, "A Journey of Wonders", centres on the story of a renowned and progressive leader, Prof. Tan Sri Dato' Sri Dr. Noor Azlan Ghazali, who believes in values-based actions to ensure transformation by holding on to two important guiding principles in discharging his duties as the Vice-Chancellor-sincerity, and honesty.
